**REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE FIVE YEAR
B.A., LL.B / B. B. A., LL. B. / B.Com ., LL.B INTEGRATED
DEGREE COURSE IN LAW**

THE COURSE & DURATION

I. B.A., LL.B

- a) B. A., LL. B. integrated double degree course combines Bachelors' degree course in Arts together with the Bachelors' degree course in law.
- b) The duration of the B. A., LL. B. course shall be five academic years consisting of ten semesters.
- c) Each Academic Year shall be divided into two Semesters.
- d) Each Semester shall consist of 18 weeks.
- e) The papers and the syllabus shall be as given in the Schedule appended to these Regulations.

II. B.B.A., LL.B

- a) B.B.A., LL.B. integrated double degree course combines Bachelors' degree course in Business Administration together with the Bachelors' degree course in law.
- b) The duration of the B. B. A., LL. B. course shall be five academic years consisting of ten semesters.
- c) Each Academic Year shall be divided into two Semesters.
- d) Each Semester shall consist of 18 weeks.
- e) The papers and the syllabus shall be as given in the Schedule appended to these Regulations.

III. B.Com., LL.B

- a. B.Com., LL.B integrated double degree course combines Bachelors' degree course in Bachelors of Commerce together with the Bachelors' degree course in law.
- b. The duration of the B.Com., LL.B. course shall be five academic years consisting of ten semesters.
- c. Each Academic Year shall be divided into two Semesters.
- d. Each Semester shall consist of 18 weeks.
- e. The papers and the syllabus shall be as given in the Schedule appended to these Regulations.

INSTRUCTIONS & TRAINING

- a) Instructions and training for the course shall be not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercise and seminars provided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week.
- b) There shall be for each paper four class hours of one hour duration each and one hour of tutorial/moot court/project work per week.
- c) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 20 weeks of internship during the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government.
- d) The internship in any year cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and all students shall at least gone through once in the entire academic period with Trial and Appellate Advocates.
- e) Each student shall keep internship diary in the form stipulated by the University and the same shall be evaluated by the Guide in Internship and also a Core Faculty member of the staff each time. The total mark shall be assessed in the Final Semester of the course in the 4th Clinical course as stipulated under the Schedule appended to these Regulations.

EXPLANATION

A College or Department shall be deemed to be working whole time if the working time of the College or University Department extends to at least eight hours continuously on every working day comprising of class room teaching of four periods, each period being of one hour duration and the remaining four hours devoted to clinical, curricular and co-curricular activities.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- a. An applicant who has successfully completed Pre-University Course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate Course) from a recognised University of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognised by the Union or by the State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognised by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.

Provided that applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate or First Degree Certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission to the course.

Provided further that the applicants who have obtained 10+2 or graduation or post-graduation through open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission to the course.

- b. Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.
- c. Maximum age for seeking admission is limited to twenty years in case of general category of applicants and twenty two years in the case of applicants from SC, ST and other backward communities as on 1st June.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission to the course shall be made strictly on the basis of the merit taking into account total marks obtained in the qualifying examination.

Provided that while making admission to the course reservation policy of the Government of Karnataka governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall be applied.

INTAKE

- a) No College or Department of Studies in Law authorised to impart education in the B.A., LL.B / B. B. A., LL. B. / B.Com., LL.B degree course shall admit more than 60 students in one division.
- b) The University shall reserve the right to prescribe the number of divisions in each Law College or the Department of Studies in Law.

TUITION AND OTHER FEES

Candidate seeking admission to the Five Year B.A., LL.B / B. B. A., LL. B. / B.Com., LL.B degree course and those admitted to such course shall pay the tuition and other fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

CURRICULA

- c) Candidates admitted to the Five Year B.A., LL.B / B. B. A., LL. B. / B.Com., LL.B degree course shall have to attend 10 Semester courses spread over 5 years.
- d) In each Semester, the students shall have to study the courses prescribed by the University in these Regulations.
- e) The course descriptions shall be, as set out from time to time, in the Schedule.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction in the Five Year B.A., LL.B / B. B. A., LL. B. / B.Com., LL.B degree course shall be English. However, the examinees shall have the option to answer the question papers in the examination either in English or in Kannada.

ATTENDANCE

- No student shall be permitted to appear for the end-of-semester examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 70% attendance in the course concerned.
- Provided that a student who has attended not less than 65% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College or the Dean of the Faculty as the case may be.

PROHIBITION AGAINST LATERAL ENTRY AND EXIT

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding a degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course.

PROMOTION

- a. No student shall be promoted to the next year of the course unless he/she has passed in a minimum of two subjects in either semester or one subject in each semester.
- b. Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within ten years from admission to the course.

AWARD OF THE DEGREE

A student shall be eligible for the award of the B.A., LL.B. (Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws) / B.B. A., LL. B. (Bachelor of Business Administration and

Bachelor of Laws) / B.Com., LL.B. (Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Laws) Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in all the semesters provided his or her character and conduct are found to be satisfactory during the course.

AWARD OF CLASSES

The award of classes shall be as under:

THE COLLEGE AUTHORITIES SHALL ENSURE SUBMISSION OF THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS BY THE APPLICANT TO THE COLLEGE, AS BELOW.

- a) The Eligibility Certificate issued by the University, in case of Non-Karnataka and Foreign students at the time of admission.
- b) 10th Std. Marks Card & PUC / 12th Std. / HSC or any equivalent examination marks cards in case of 5 year LL.B admission, at the time of admission.
- c) The Transfer & Migration Certificates shall be submitted by the students to the college at the time of admission or within one month from the date of admission to the college.
- d) In case of SC / ST / Cat – I/ OBC student, Caste & Income Certificate shall be submitted by the student to the college at the time of admission.

ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

- The applicant who has passed the prescribed qualifying examination from recognized University / Boards of Examination that are situated outside Karnataka or in a Foreign Country shall compulsorily obtain the ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE before taking the admission.
- Such candidates may apply for the Eligibility Certificate to the KSLU with necessary documents in the prescribed form through the college by post or in person by paying necessary fees, to the office of KSLU, Hubballi along with all original marks cards of 10th, 12th Std & U.G as applicable along with transcripts issued by the concerned University or Board or Department.

- The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the KSLU Academic Section at Hubballi for those candidates who have obtained their qualifying degree / certificate outside the Karnataka state and all the foreign candidates / applicants.
- The qualifying degree / certificates should be in Kannada or English only.
- All those candidates who have obtained qualifying certificate from outside Karnataka State should produce the countersigned original certificates from the issuing authorities / Universities, otherwise eligibility will not be considered.
- Fees for Eligibility Certificate shall be paid as prescribed by the University.

SYLLABUS

- The syllabus prescribed by the University from time to time.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- Each course carrying 100 marks, 20 marks shall be awarded by way of Internal assessment.
- The end of the semester examination shall be conducted for 80 marks.
- A student should secure a minimum of 40% of the marks in the end semester examination to be declared as pass in that paper provided, he / she has secured a minimum of 40 marks in that paper along with internal assessment marks. That is, a student has to secure a minimum of 32 marks in each paper in end semester examination.

TEACHING HOURS

Each paper shall be taught for 6+2 hours in a week devoting 6 hours for theory and 2 hours for Seminar / Tutorial.
