## 1. REPORT ON ARMY DAY MELA

The event took place on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2025 at Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw Parade Ground Bangalore.

Major General V T Mathew, General Officer Commanding of the Karnataka and Kerala Sub Area, formally launched the event by releasing tricolour balloons and honouring the Veer Naaris. Meanwhile, NCC students were eager to learn, receiving guidance from army personnel on the proper handling of rifles.

The ShwetAshwa motorcycle display team from the Corps of Military Police mesmerized the audience with their heart-stopping stunts, showcasing the team's daring spirit and precision. With a rich history dating back to 1952, the team has earned three Guinness World Records, including a remarkable feat of carrying 48 members on a single motorcycle in 2010.

The ShwetAshwa team has a long history of performing impressive stunts, having been formed in 1952 at the CMP Centre and School in Faizabad. They have performed at various national and international events, including the Asian Games and Republic Day Parade.

The event also featured a thrilling performance by the Gorkhas from the 4/8 Gorkha Rifles, who performed the traditional Khukri Dance, leaving the audience in awe. Adding to the grandeur of the event, the Army Pipe Band enthralled the audience with their synchronized tunes, perfectly capturing the essence of the occasion.

The event showcased a wide range of combat technologies, including Tanks with Mine-Clearing Capabilities, bulletproof vehicles, and the Wayanad Bailey Bridge.<sup>1</sup> Visitors were also able to interact with soldiers in full battle gear, who provided hands-on experience with the equipment.

Various Demonstrations included:

- Para-Motor Gliding: showcasing the Army's aerial capabilities
- Motorcycle Stunts: performed by the Tornados team
- Combat Bridge-Laying: exhibiting the Army's engineering prowess

Other attractions included:

- Sporting Activities: ceremonial and fun horse riding
- Interactive Sessions: children interacted with Army dogs and horses
- Simulators: providing a unique experience of Army vehicles

The event also featured informative stalls on Recruitment, Medical Assistance, the Army Placement Cell, and the Veterans Help Desk, attracting many aspirants and ex-service personnel.




## 2. REPORT ON STREET PLAY- ARMY DAY : WHISPERS OF VALOR : UNTOLD TALES OF THE BRAVE


B certificate examination includes Practical Evaluation and Written Examination




## 9. REPORT ON CIVIL DEFENCE MOCK DRILL




## 12. REPORT ON YOGA DAY EVENT

### 13. REPORT ON DRUG AWARENESS PROGRAMME



The event began with a presentation on Drug Awareness delivered by CDT. Sairaman and CDT. Sreeja Reddy Vemlupati. The cadets explained:

### 17. REPORT ON PRE IGC 3 (AITSC) CAMP :








## 25. PRE IGC 1 – RDC 2026




## 26. ENROLLMENT – NCC BATCH OF 2025




### 34. LEADERSHIP AND TEAM BUILDING CAMP, 2025
