Day-1: 12th August 2025 (Tuesday)

Day 4: 16th August 2025 (Saturday) - Report on Anti-Ragging Awareness Drive by Sadashivanagar Police Station

The Anti-Ragging Awareness Drive Programme was organized by Ramaiah College of Law, on 16th August 2025 in association with Sadashivanagar Police Station, Ms. Durga Bhavani U, Police Sub-Inspector, was the Resource person of the programme with the objective of sensitizing students about the harmful effects of ragging and the strict legal consequences associated with it.

The programme began with an inaugural address by the college authorities, highlighting the institution's commitment to maintaining a safe and inclusive campus environment. The officials from Sadashiv Nagar Police Station interacted with students, spreading awareness about the laws and regulations related to ragging, including the punishments prescribed under the Indian Penal Code and the guidelines of the UGC and Supreme Court of India.

The police officers emphasized that ragging is a serious criminal offense and explained how indulging in such activities can adversely affect one's academic

career and future prospects. They also encouraged students to report any incidents of ragging without fear, assuring full support and protection to victims and whistle-blower's.

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where students clarified their doubts regarding legal procedures and preventive measures. The programme served as a powerful reminder that ragging in any form is unacceptable and reaffirmed the collective responsibility of students, faculty, and law enforcement authorities to uphold a ragging-free campus.
