



FEDERATION OF MOOTERS CONCLAVE REPORT – 2025

I. Federation of Mooters

The Federation of Mooters, a brainchild of the Ramaiah College of Law Moot Court Committee (RCL MCC), has been established under Chapter VI of the Ramaiah College of Law Moot Court Committee Regulations, 2023, to guide and support the various activities of the committee, particularly in the organization of moot court competitions. The Federation comprises alumni who were actively involved in mooting during their time at RCL, and additional alumni may also be invited to join with the prior consent of the faculty coordinators and the Principal. Membership in the Federation is lifelong, enabling sustained engagement and contribution. The Federation's functions include mentoring students in mooting and related competitions, organizing and adjudicating intra-collegiate moot court events, and undertaking any other activities necessary to nurture a robust mooting culture within the institution.

II. Event Details

The Federation of Mooters Conclave 2025 took place on 8th June 2025 in the Boardroom at Ramaiah College of Law, running from 10 A.M. to 1 P.M. The meeting was convened under the guidance of Professor Umamahesh Sathyanarayana, the Principal of RCL. This gathering brought together a vibrant mix of alumni mooters and student coordinators. The conclave served as a valuable platform to engage in meaningful discussions about enhancing mooting culture, sharing experiences, and exploring innovative avenues for collaboration and development within the college's mooting ecosystem. During the event, a plan was also presented for hosting the International Commercial Arbitration (ICA) moot competition within the premises of RCL, marking an ambitious step forward for the college's mooting activities. Another highlight of the conclave was the unveiling of the Federation of Mooters board by Mr. Gagan Ganapathy, founder of Lawyers Transcontinental and an alumnus from the batch of 1998, whose visionary idea led to the creation of the Federation of Mooters itself.

III. Objective of Organizing the Event

The purpose behind organizing the Federation of Mooters conclave was to create a forum where distinguished alumni mooters could reconnect with the institution and contribute to its ongoing journey of academic and professional excellence. The event aimed to foster mentorship ties, encourage constructive dialogue on improving the standards of moot competitions, and explore strategic partnerships. It was designed to strengthen the bond between alumni mooters and current students, ensuring that RCL's mooting activities continue to evolve and thrive with contemporary legal trends and industry needs. Another key objective was to present the proposal for conducting the International Commercial Arbitration (ICA) moot, envisioned as the first of its kind at RCL, and to invite the alumni mooters to scrutinize, examine, evaluate, and provide insightful feedback on its structure, feasibility, and potential impact on the proposed structure and execution of this significant new initiative.

IV. Outcome and Feedback

The conclave led to several productive discussions and actionable takeaways. One of the central themes was transitioning alumni mentorship towards more specialized areas of law, enabling students to gain insights into niche legal practices. A significant portion of the meeting focused on the proposal for conducting the International Commercial Arbitration (ICA) moot, which was thoroughly scrutinised and deliberated upon by the alumni mooters. They engaged in thoughtful discussions about the structure, feasibility, and potential benefits of hosting such a pioneering competition at RCL. Alumni also highlighted the need to enhance the quality of judging in moots by developing a robust scoring framework and ensuring that judges are well-briefed. Additional ideas included introducing complementary events, such as essay competitions and focused roundtable discussions tied to moot topics, to broaden engagement and learning. Overall, the event reaffirmed the commitment of both alumni and the institution to elevate the standards of mooting at RCL, combining tradition with innovation for future success.

MEETING CONVENED BY: Professor Umamahesh Sathyanarayana (Principal, Ramaiah College of Law)

AGENDA: The Federation of mooters conclave brings together our distinguished alumni to foster mentorship, collaboration, opportunities, and institutional growth. This gathering aims to exchange ideas, strengthen alumni-student relations, and discuss the future of mooting at RCL.

DATE: 08.06.2025

VENUE: Boardroom, Ramaiah College of Law

TIMINGS: 10 A.M. - 1 P.M.

IMPORTANT CONVERSATIONS AND DECISIONS TAKEN-

1. A detailed discussion was held on the future of mooters and the need to shift mentorship from general legal practice to specific, focused areas.
2. The efficient working of the college and KSLU was brought up, and acknowledgment to the college was given regarding its future implementations.
3. The idea of collaborating with institutional and title partners like Microsoft and Infosys were explored to enhance the standard of competitions.
4. It was proposed that instead of seeking a title partner, the focus should be on securing adequate funds through multiple smaller partnerships.
5. The committee discussed hosting the ICA (International Commercial Arbitration) within the premises of the college (Ramaiah College of Law) with the involvement of legal heads from leading tech companies.
6. A hybrid model of sending invitations to colleges was suggested, combining both physical and digital formats to increase outreach and efficiency.
7. Alumni raised concerns about the quality of judging and emphasized the need for a proper scoring structure and well-briefed judges.

8. The importance of appointing qualified proposition drafters who can create contemporary and industry-specific legal problems was highlighted.
9. Suggestions were made to conduct ancillary and additional events like essay competitions and roundtable sessions, aligning with the subject matter of the moot to promote engagement.
10. It was agreed that training for core mooting skills including oral arguments and legal research should be carried out through intra moots, YouTube content, and newsletters.
11. The committee decided to gather alumni preferences through Google Sheets to form interest-based committees and ensure effective media coverage before, during, and after the competition.

18TH LAWASIA INTERNATIONAL MOOT COMPETITION (INTERNATIONAL ROUNDS), 2023

Ramaiah College of Law, in collaboration with LAWASIA – The Law Association for Asia and the Pacific – and the Bar Association of India, proudly hosted the international rounds of the 18th LAWASIA International Moot Court Competition.

The event offered a unique platform for cross-cultural academic exchange and showcased the college's capacity to organize and execute high-calibre international competitions. The event brought together 7 international teams from leading institutions across Asia-Pacific, with teams from Vietnam, Singapore, Malaysia, Cambodia, and India.

Over 60 adjudicators, including former judges and renowned legal professionals, presided over the rounds. With over 400 student volunteers and significant institutional support, the four-day event included multiple competition rounds, cultural engagement, and networking opportunities. The moot problem explored contemporary legal issues surrounding AI and technology, encouraging dynamic advocacy from participants.

The final bench featured eminent jurists such as Justice Dato' Mah Weng Kwai (Retired Judge, Court of Appeal, Malaysia), Justice S. Rajendra Babu (Retired Chief Justice of India), and Hon'ble Justice Riethmuller (Judge of Federal Circuit and Court of Australia).

The Valedictory Ceremony held at the Four Seasons, Bangalore, was graced by distinguished dignitaries including Mr. R. Venkataramani (Attorney General of India), Dr. Gordon Hughes AM (Secretary-General, LAWASIA), Mr. Raphael Tay (Chair, LAWASIA Moot Committee), Mr. Shyam Divan (President-elect, LAWASIA) and various other distinguished dignitaries.

Isomi Suzuki focused on the significant role played by moot court competitions in fostering a platform for the exchange of compelling arguments. Such exchanges serve as valuable opportunities for participants to engage in reasoned discourse, ultimately leading to the resolution of disputes. Seven qualifying teams, including participants from NLU Jodhpur, and Singapore Management University, Singapore, are set to compete in the international rounds.



The four-day-long competition will feature various sessions, culminating in the determination of the winning team on November 27. The moot problem is based on Artificial Intelligence and its interplay with technology. It aligns with the nuances of the just jurisdiction, ensuring a relevant connection between the legal issues addressed and the legal landscape and culture of the host country. Since its inception in 2005, it has grown, currently spanning across 60 law schools from 30 jurisdictions, including Singapore, Malaysia, Hong Kong, United Kingdom, China and Australia.
