

## Day 1

### **Visit to Ludhiana Panchayat, Sirmaur (Himachal Pradesh)**

#### **Organized by:**

Ramaiah College of Law Objective: The objective of the visit was to promote awareness about organic farming, understand rural governance, foster community engagement, and build cultural exchange between students and the local population of Sirmaur.

#### **Event Highlights:**

The day began with a warm traditional welcome by the organic farmers at the Ludhiana Panchayat office. Our NSS convenor, Ajay, delivered a welcome speech, followed by an address from the Pradhan of the Panchayat. We interacted with several farmers practicing organic agriculture, distributed informative pamphlets, and performed cultural dances including Himachali and Pahadi folk dances. The group also visited the nearby village, interacted with the women's council representative, and recorded a short documentary clip of her sharing her experiences. The villagers then graciously invited us to their homes and farms, where we observed organic farming techniques firsthand.

#### **Achievements:**

1. Successfully engaged with over 20 local organic farmers.
2. Promoted awareness about sustainable and organic farming practices.
3. Strengthened student understanding of rural administration and panchayat functioning.
4. Fostered a cultural exchange through folk dances and conversations.
5. Distributed educational pamphlets on organic farming in the local language.
6. Recorded interviews/documentaries for future awareness campaigns.

#### **Outcome:**

The visit significantly enhanced our practical knowledge of organic farming and grassroots governance. It helped bridge the urban-rural divide and fostered mutual respect and learning between students and villagers. The interactions also motivated villagers, especially women, to continue sustainable practices with renewed encouragement.

The first day of the NSS camp was a meaningful blend of learning, cultural immersion, and service. It laid a strong foundation for the days to come and reinforced the importance of community collaboration in driving social and environmental change.



## **DAY 2**

### **Visit to Renuka Ji Temple and Wildlife Sanctuary and Environmental Protection Campaign**

#### **1. Events detail :**

Overview:

As part of a 7-day educational and outreach program, Day 2 involved a visit to the sacred Renuka Ji Temple and the adjoining Renuka Wildlife Sanctuary. The day featured two awareness campaigns organized by the NSS Committee of Ramaiah College of Law Bengaluru :focusing on Environmental Protection and the other on Wildlife Conservation

#### **2. Objective(s) of the Event**

- To raise awareness about the importance of preserving natural habitats and wildlife.
- To instill a sense of environmental responsibility among the student volunteers.
- To encourage community engagement in sustainable practices and conservation efforts.:

On the 11th of May, 2025, from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM, the NSS Committee of Ramaiah College of Law, Bengaluru, organized an enriching visit to the sacred Renuka Ji Temple and the adjacent Renuka Wildlife Sanctuary in Sirmaur, Himachal Pradesh. This initiative was part of a broader 7-day educational and outreach program designed to integrate legal education with environmental consciousness. The day's agenda prominently featured two key awareness campaigns—one emphasizing environmental protection and the other focusing on wildlife conservation. These campaigns were conceived to not only raise awareness but also to instill a deep-rooted sense of ecological responsibility among the participating students.

The primary objectives of this visit were to highlight the importance of preserving natural habitats and wildlife, foster a culture of environmental responsibility among young legal minds, and encourage proactive community

engagement in sustainable and conservation-oriented practices. The Renuka Ji site was selected for its dual significance—being both ecologically rich and spiritually revered. The choice of location provided an ideal setting to bridge the domains of spirituality, education, and environmental stewardship, resonating with the college's holistic vision of legal education that encompasses social and ecological accountability.

#### ACTIVITIES:


The event saw the active participation of 27 enthusiastic NSS volunteers from Ramaiah College of Law, guided and inspired by the presence of Dr. Vijay Kumar, a respected member of the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Himachal Pradesh. The audience comprised a diverse mix, including law students, faculty members, local forest officials, and residents of Sirmaur, all of whom shared a vested interest in ecological conservation and legal advocacy.

Organized by the NSS Committee in collaboration with the DLSA of Sirmaur and with generous support from the Himachal Pradesh Forest Department, the day was marked by several impactful activities. At the sanctuary entrance, students led an interactive awareness drive on the significance of environmental and wildlife protection. This was followed by an insightful educational talk delivered by Dr. Vijay Kumar, who elaborated on the legal framework underpinning wildlife conservation in India. The students also had the opportunity to visit the Renuka Ji Temple, during which they were sensitized to the ecological features of the surrounding area. Furthermore, engaging dialogues with local forest rangers and DLSA officials offered the students a practical understanding of ground-level conservation strategies and legal enforcement.

#### OUTCOME AND FEEDBACK

The outcomes of the day were both profound and promising. Students gained enhanced awareness of environmental laws and the critical role of legal professionals in advocacy and enforcement. The event also fortified the partnership between the NSS unit and the DLSA, setting the stage for future collaborative efforts. As a tangible commitment to the cause, the students pledged to initiate mini awareness projects within their respective localities, thereby extending the impact of their experience beyond the duration of the visit.

Feedback collected from student volunteers, faculty coordinators, and local authorities indicated a resounding success. Participants reported a renewed sense of purpose and a clearer understanding of their potential influence as future lawyers in promoting and protecting environmental integrity.





## Day 3

### BAUNAL VILLAGE VISIT

As part of the NSS Special Camp, the students and faculty members of Ramaiah College of Law visited Baunal Panchayat, a scenic and culturally rich village in Renukaji, Himachal Pradesh. The visit was designed to provide law students with real-time exposure to grassroots legal, social, and educational issues and to contribute meaningfully to rural development through interactive initiatives.

#### **Objectives of the Event:**

The major objective was to conduct a socio-legal survey aimed at identifying and understanding the prevalent legal, social, and infrastructural issues faced by rural communities and promote legal awareness and disseminate basic legal knowledge among villagers. The other objective was to conduct educational awareness campaign defining the government schemes and job opportunities available for different higher education courses.

#### **Introduction & Significance:**

The initiative stems from the core NSS vision of “Not Me, But You,” reflecting a deep sense of social responsibility and civic engagement. Baunal Panchayat, located in the hilly terrains of Himachal Pradesh, was selected for its limited access to legal and educational resources. The programme sought to enhance the community’s understanding of their rights and the importance of education, while also providing law students with a transformative field-learning experience.

#### **Details of Resource Persons and Participants:**

**Activities and Highlights:**

The day's programme at Baunal Panchayat was thoughtfully divided into a series of structured and impactful activities. It began with a socio-legal survey conducted by the student members. During these interactions, villagers were asked about their access to legal remedies, awareness of government welfare schemes, and the educational status within their families. The survey also explored common local issues such as land rights disputes, instances of domestic violence, and challenges related to public health infrastructure. The insights gathered helped members tailor their subsequent awareness programmes more effectively.

Following the survey, a legal literacy awareness session was conducted by volunteer Abdul Azeez under faculty supervision. The session aimed to simplify critical legal concepts for the local population. Key topics included an overview of Fundamental Rights and Duties under the Indian Constitution, an introduction to domestic violence laws, the right to free legal aid, and basic guidance on how to approach police stations or legal authorities in case of grievances. The session was conducted in an interactive format, allowing villagers to voice their concerns and share personal experiences. This interactive dialogue helped build a trusting environment and encouraged active community participation.

Parallel to the legal literacy session, an educational awareness programme was led by members Khyathi and Suriyah. Their presentation emphasized the value of primary and secondary education, particularly the importance of continuing education for girls. They discussed various government initiatives, such as mid-day meal schemes, scholarship opportunities, and the growing availability of digital learning platforms. As part of this initiative, informative pamphlets were distributed among the villagers. These pamphlets contained practical information on steps to enroll children in school, outlined the rights provided under the Right to Education Act, and listed relevant helpline numbers and local educational offices. The initiative was particularly well received by the women in the community, many of whom expressed a newfound interest in pursuing educational opportunities for their children, especially their daughters.

To conclude the day, a vibrant cultural exchange was organized, creating a space for celebration and connection. Mr. Prem Sharma, a renowned folk singer hailing from Baunal village, performed a series of traditional Himachali songs that beautifully captured the essence of the local culture. In a touching gesture of cultural reciprocity, the NSS members responded with performances of Kannada songs, showcasing the spirit of India's cultural diversity and unity. This segment was emotionally enriching and served as a bridge between the visiting team and the host community, adding a joyful and celebratory conclusion to an impactful day.

### **Outcomes and Achievements:**

The community outreach programme at Baunal Panchayat significantly contributed to **community empowerment**. Through the legal literacy and educational awareness sessions, villagers gained a clearer understanding of their fundamental rights and the mechanisms available for legal recourse. Information about free legal aid, domestic violence protections, and government-sponsored educational schemes helped bridge a critical knowledge gap. The distribution of easy-to-understand pamphlets further ensured that this knowledge would remain accessible even after the departure of the NSS team. Many villagers, particularly women, expressed a renewed interest in ensuring educational continuity for their children and engaging more actively with legal and civic institutions. This marked a substantial step toward long-term community development and self-advocacy.

For the student members, the visit was a catalyst for **personal and professional development**. Engaging in field-based socio-legal surveys allowed them to practice research methodology in real-world settings. They honed skills in communication, public speaking, and the simplification of complex legal concepts for diverse audiences. Moreover, the experience cultivated cultural sensitivity, as students had to adapt their language, approach, and teaching style to suit the community's needs. Leading awareness sessions, managing logistics, and responding to on-ground challenges gave students a deeper understanding of their responsibilities as future legal professionals and socially conscious citizens.

The programme also resulted in **enhanced engagement** between Ramaiah College of Law and the rural community of Baunal. It demonstrated the potential of academic institutions to extend their influence beyond the classroom and contribute meaningfully to grassroots change. By initiating direct dialogues with the villagers and addressing their concerns, the college established a relationship built on mutual respect and cooperation. This foundation paves the way for future collaborations in areas such as legal aid camps, education drives, and rights-based advocacy.

A major highlight of the event was the **cultural integration** that took place during the concluding segment of the programme. The shared performances by a renowned Himachali folk singer and the Kannada songs sung by the NSS members, fostered a deep emotional connection between the hosts and the visitors. These interactions beautifully embodied the ethos of "Unity in Diversity," allowing both groups to celebrate their distinct cultural identities while finding common ground in music and art. The cultural exchange was not just entertainment; it was a symbolic expression of solidarity and mutual appreciation.

Finally, the event led to the collection of **actionable feedback**, both during and after the formal activities. Students documented the concerns raised by villagers, ranging from the need for legal aid in property disputes to requests for educational workshops focused on digital literacy. This feedback is invaluable for planning future NSS initiatives and academic research projects. It ensures that subsequent interventions are tailored to the real needs of the community and fosters a feedback loop that is essential for sustained impact and improvement.

**Feedback and Evaluation:**


- Feedback collected from villagers showed a positive response, especially towards the legal and educational components.

## Day 4

### **Visit to Sangrah Degree College, Himachal Pradesh**

#### **Objective(s) of the Event:**

By facilitating a shared platform for traditional performances, educational discussions, and institutional collaboration, the event helped create a stronger sense of unity among the youth from Karnataka and Himachal Pradesh.

#### **Introduction & Significance:**

On the fourth day of our inter-state visit, the NSS team from Ramaiah College of Law visited Sangrah Degree College in Himachal Pradesh. The visit was a key milestone in the larger initiative of inter-regional harmony, aimed at celebrating India's cultural diversity. The day was filled with vibrant performances, intellectual presentations, and meaningful exchanges. Importantly, the event was recognized in a local newspaper under the headline **“HIMALAYAS MEET BENGALURU Colleges sign Landmark agreement for National Integration,”** emphasizing its impact on promoting unity through education and culture.

#### **Cultural Exchange Performances:**

The event began with a warm welcome, followed by a cultural showcase from both institutions. Students from Ramaiah College of Law presented **traditional Karnataka folk dances**, performed by Prof. Brinda Balaji, members -Khyathi, Chandana ,Chukki, Arunaswami, Suriyah, Akash,Abhinam. Their Performance brought alive the rhythmic and expressive spirit of Karnataka's rich heritage, captivating the audience.

#### **3. Activities :**



For example, in collaboration with local citizen groups and festivals such as the Kadlekai Parishe in Bengaluru, Ecofold helped produce tens of thousands of newspaper-bags in order to shift away from single-use plastic bags. The “Eco Paper Bag Day” workshop is not just about making paper bags, but about instilling a mindset of reuse, recycling and conscious consumption. By learning how to convert waste paper into functional bags, participants take a tangible step towards environmental sustainability while also equipping themselves with practical, hands-on skills.

**Objective(s) of the Event:** The main objective of the “Eco Paper Bag Day,” organized by the NSS Unit of Ramaiah College of Law in collaboration with eco fold plastic-free kadlekai parishe, was to promote environmental sustainability and reduce the use of plastic by encouraging the making and usage of eco-friendly paper bags. The session aimed to educate students about the importance of recycling, reusability, and adopting sustainable alternatives to plastic.

**NSS Regular Activity – Report on Soil Health and Teen Pregnancy  
Awareness Programmes at Hayyal-B and Nalwar , Yadagiri,  
Karnataka.**

**Introduction**

Ramaiah College of Law, Bengaluru, through its NSS Unit, organized a two-day community outreach programme in Yadgiri District as part of the NSS Regular Activity. The programme focused on Soil Health Awareness among farmers and Teen/Child Pregnancy Awareness among school students. The programme aimed to empower the rural community with knowledge, promote sustainable agricultural practices, create awareness on adolescent reproductive health, and



strengthen the values of social responsibility and leadership among NSS volunteers.

## **Day 1 – Visit to Hayyal-B Village: Soil Health Awareness and Teen Pregnancy Awareness**

The first day of the programme was conducted at Hayyal-B village. The session began with a welcome address by Pruthviraj, NSS volunteer, who introduced the resource person **Dr. Shyamrao Kulkarni, Associate Professor, Department of Agronomy, College of Agriculture, Bheemarayanagudi, UAS Raichur**, who has **25 years of experience in the field of agriculture**.

Dr. Shyamrao Kulkarni delivered a detailed awareness session to **more than 100 farmers** of Hayyal-B village. He explained the importance of soil health and the necessity of regular soil and mud testing. He described the characteristics of healthy soil and methods to maintain soil quality. He emphasized the scientific and proper use of fertilizers in the right quantities and discussed integrated nutrient management techniques.

He further highlighted how modern technology can simplify agricultural work, explained the impact of climate change on crop production, and suggested practical methods to overcome these challenges. He also spoke about different types of insects that affect crops and shared natural, eco-friendly methods to prevent pest attacks, including the use of fermented (stinking) jaggery solution to repel insects. He concluded his session by addressing the issue of high expenditure in farming compared to revenue and advised farmers to adopt cost-effective methods to reduce unnecessary expenses.

On the same day, an awareness programme on **Teen/Child Pregnancy** was conducted at the **Government High School, Hayyal-B**. NSS volunteers educated the students about the causes, risks, physical and psychological effects of teenage pregnancy. They explained the importance of reproductive health education, prevention methods, and responsible decision-making. Students were encouraged to ask questions, and interactive sessions were conducted to clear their doubts.

As part of the awareness activity, NSS volunteers also performed an informative **skit** under the guidance of the school Headmaster **Sharanappa Shrishad**, which helped students understand the importance of responsible behaviour, health education, and informed choices.

## **Achievements**

- Effectively engaged with **more than 100 local farmers**.
- Promoted knowledge about sustainable and organic farming practices.
- Strengthened farmers' understanding of modern and scientific agricultural techniques.
- Conducted Teen Pregnancy Awareness Programmes in **two schools**.
- Helped students develop informed perspectives on preventing teenage pregnancy.
- Communicated openly with students to address doubts and clarify misconceptions.
- Encouraged farmers to adopt cost-effective methods to reduce unnecessary expenditure.

### **Outcome**

The farmers' awareness programme led to long-term developmental commitments. The **University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS), Raichur** agreed to conduct a **70-day intensive training programme** for the farmers of Hayyal-B village. As part of this initiative, **agriculture staff and students will stay in the village** and work directly with farmers, providing continuous field-level guidance to help them grow better and healthier crops. They will also give step-by-step instructions on soil preparation, seed selection, crop protection, and sustainable practices.

Furthermore, the **village heads and community leaders** unanimously decided to seek regular guidance and technical assistance from the **College of Agriculture, Bheemarayanagudi, UAS Raichur**, and to actively cooperate in implementing scientific farming practices in their village.

In addition, the visit significantly enriched the practical understanding of organic farming and grassroots realities. It helped bridge the urban–rural gap and fostered mutual respect and learning between the farmers and the resource person. The interactions inspired farmers to continue and strengthen sustainable agricultural practices with renewed motivation.

The teen pregnancy awareness sessions also made a meaningful impact. The skit and interactive sessions helped students understand responsible behaviour,

health education, and the importance of informed decision-making, creating lasting awareness among young learners.

### **Conclusion**

The first day of the NSS camp was a valuable blend of agricultural learning and adolescent awareness. It laid a strong foundation for the next day's programme and emphasized the importance of collective community efforts in bringing social and environmental change.





## **Day 2 –**

### **Nalwar Government High School: Street Play and Expert Lecture on Teen Pregnancy and Domestic Violence**

After the trekking we conducted an awareness programme at **Nalwar Government High School** from **12:00 PM to 3:00 PM**. The programme was organised for students of **8th, 9th, and 10th standards** and focused on teenage pregnancy, domestic violence, and legal awareness.

As part of the programme, NSS volunteers presented an impactful **street play** depicting the causes and consequences of teenage pregnancy and the serious issue of domestic violence. The performance helped students understand the emotional, social, and personal impact of these problems in a simple and relatable manner. Students actively watched the play and participated in post-performance discussions.


Students also gave short presentations on domestic violence and child protection laws, including the provisions of the **POCSO Act**, which helped simplify complex legal concepts.

They became more aware of the physical and emotional challenges associated with early pregnancy and were encouraged to make responsible decisions regarding their sexual and reproductive health.

The combined use of street play, student presentations, and expert medical guidance ensured an engaging and effective learning experience.




