This was followed by a Legal Literacy Session led by NSS volunteers under faculty supervision, simplifying concepts such as Fundamental Rights, Duties, free legal aid, and protection under domestic violence laws.

Parallely, an Educational Awareness Session emphasized the significance of schooling, girl-child education, and government scholarship schemes, supplemented with pamphlets listing practical information on enrollment and helplines. The day concluded with a cultural exchange, including performances by renowned Himachali folk singer Prem Sharma and Kannada songs by the student volunteers, beautifully reflecting the spirit of Unity in Diversity. The event not only empowered villagers with vital legal and educational knowledge but also offered students transformative field-learning in community lawyering, research methods, and cultural sensitivity.

Cultural Exchange with Sangrah Degree College

The NSS team engaged in a cultural and academic exchange program with Sangrah Degree College, Himachal Pradesh. The highlight of the program was a joint cultural showcase, where students from both institutions performed traditional Karnataka and Himachali folk dances and songs, including a collaborative "Nati" performance, symbolizing national integration.

Educational presentations followed the performances, covering topics such as Karnataka's diverse art and culture, cybercrime awareness, and disaster management strategies, which were particularly relevant for the hilly terrain. A landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Ramaiah College of Law and Sangrah Degree College to collaborate on cultural exchange, legal awareness, academic symposia, and community outreach. The event received media recognition under the headline "HIMALAYAS MEET BENGALURU", highlighting its national integration impact.

Awareness Campaigns and Closing Ceremony at IIT Sirmaur

At IIT Sirmaur Campus and Renuka Ji, the NSS team organized a series of awareness programs, culminating in the closing ceremony. The day featured a Cybercrime Awareness Session conducted by specialists in cyber law and digital security, an engaging street play on drug and narcotics abuse performed by NSS volunteers, and a plantation drive promoting environmental sustainability.

The closing ceremony included cultural reflections, a vote of thanks by Prof. Brinda Balaji, and a felicitation of student volunteers with traditional Pahadi Topis by representatives of the DLSA, Sirmaur. Students expressed a deep sense of fulfillment, with sessions on cyber safety, drug abuse, and sustainability leaving a strong impact on both the local community and participating volunteers.



NAVIGATING THE LEGAL JOURNEY: LAW SCHOOL, PLACEMENTS AND CAREER

WORKSHOP ON CONTRACT DRAFTING

WORKSHOP ON THE ART OF CROSS - EXAMINATION

The workshop on The Art of Cross Examination was conducted with the aim of introducing students to one of the most essential and nuanced skills in litigation - cross examination. The objective was to familiarise budding legal professionals with courtroom techniques, strategic questioning, and the psychological underpinnings of extracting the truth from witnesses. It also aimed to demonstrate how effective cross examination plays a crucial role in shaping the outcome of a trial.

The courtroom advocacy workshop, led by Mr. Kumar Ankit Asst.Prof, offered students an in-





depth understanding of trial strategies with a particular focus on opening statements, defence tactics, and the art of cross examination. He began by emphasizing the structure of a compelling opening - starting with a respectful greeting, stating the case clearly, and presenting key facts favouring the defence. He highlighted the importance of the defence witness in creating reasonable doubt and underscored that cross examination is a crucial tool to uncover the truth. Mr. Ankit explained that leading questions are essential to maintain control during cross examination and warned against asking explanatory or open-ended questions that could weaken the advocate's position.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES FOR CAREER ADVANCEMENT

The workshop on Foreign Language Development was organised with the aim of introducing students to the significance and advantages of learning foreign languages in today's interconnected world. The objective was to help students understand how multilingual skills can enrich their academic growth, enhance cognitive abilities, and open up a wide spectrum of international career opportunities.

The workshop began with an informative session by Ms. Savita Reddy from Inlingua, who emphasized the wide-ranging benefits of learning a foreign language. She explained how language skills not only enhance career prospects by opening doors to international job markets but also contribute to academic improvement, social confidence, and cognitive development. Ms. Reddy highlighted how language learning sharpens memory, decision-making, and communication skills, and even improves one's command over their first language. She also discussed diverse career paths available for language professionals - including roles in translation, diplomacy, journalism, and positions in global organisations like the UN and WHO - while noting the growing demand for skilled professionals in countries like Germany and Japan.
